The Sixth Form experience at Barney is driven by academic ambition, with a broad curriculum offering both A Level and BTEC courses. 
A Broad Entry

The Senior Leadership Team



Senior Management Team (SMT):

The Senior Management Team consists of the Headmaster, the Second Master, the Bursar, the Head of Prep School, the Deputy Head Academic and the Deputy Head Pastoral. This group meets weekly to address operational matters, ensure efficient decision-making, and maintain the day-to-day running of the school.

Senior Leadership Team (SLT):

The Senior Leadership Team includes the SMT along with the Directors (Sixth Form, Admissions & Marketing, Development & Alumni, Academic and Pastoral), Head of Boarding and Deputies from the Prep School. This team meets less frequently to focus on strategic planning, long-term development, and broader school initiatives.

Overall Purpose

The Director of Sixth Form is a strategic and influential leadership role, responsible for shaping and enhancing both the academic and pastoral experience of our Sixth Form students. This role will ensure students are prepared for success, not just within school, but as they transition into further education, apprenticeships, or the workforce. The post-holder will be instrumental in driving a culture of ambition, industry, and community engagement, ensuring that Barney Sixth Form students contribute meaningfully to society and aim to achieve beyond what they thought was possible.

Key Responsibilities

Strategic Leadership:

- Provide vision and direction to further the development of the Sixth Form in alignment with the whole school journey.
- Lead on initiatives that foster a sense of pride, purpose, and altruism among Sixth Form students.
- Drive the Sixth Form's academic and pastoral strategy, ensuring our students are equipped for university, apprenticeships, or the workplace.
- The Director of Sixth Form plays a vital role in establishing a culture of academic ambition that permeates throughout the entire school. By setting the academic and character development tone in the Sixth Form, this role is key in influencing the ethos and success of the School as a whole.

Senior Leadership Contribution:

- Support the Headmaster in strategic planning, including curriculum review and whole-school development initiatives.
- Attend and actively contribute to Governors' Meetings and school inspections, offering insight on the Sixth Form's performance and strategic goals.
- Build strong relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including students, parents, alumni, and external partners.
- Act as an ambassador for the school at both national and international levels, attending recruitment fairs and representing Barney in various forums.
- Ensure that the Sixth Form integrates seamlessly with whole-school development initiatives, driving innovation and excellence in both academic and extracurricular offerings.

Sixth Form Leadership:

- Lead the recruitment, admissions, and transition of students into the Sixth Form, collaborating with the Director of Marketing and Admissions and the Registrar and other relevant teams. This includes key recruitment events such as the Sixth Form Information Evenings for Year 11 and Year 10, as well as events in the wider community.
- Promote Barney's Sixth Form as a leading destination for academic and pastoral excellence for both internal and external applicants.

- Manage key staff, including the Head of Careers, Higher Education, and the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) programme.
- Oversee the UCAS application process, Oxbridge preparation, and early application strategies for fields such as medicine and veterinary science.
- Foster innovation in teaching and learning, incorporating modern technology and preparing students for an increasingly digital and AI-driven world. Ensure that Barney Sixth Formers are equipped with the technological skills necessary for success in the 21st century.
- Ensure Sixth Form students are engaged and act as role models across the school, fostering a strong work ethic and leadership among their peers.

Pastoral Care and Student Development:

- Lead the pastoral care and personal development of Sixth Form students, working with HSMs and tutors to ensure student well-being and success.
- Manage the induction of Year 11 students into the Sixth Form, providing a smooth and supportive transition.
- Foster leadership and responsibility within the Sixth Form, overseeing the selection and development of student leaders, including Monitors and Heads of Houses.
- Oversee social, cultural, and supra-curricular activities to enrich the Sixth Form experience, including debating societies, lecture clubs, and external partnerships.

Professional Development and Collaboration:

- Collaborate with the Director of Development and Alumni on engagement strategies that build meaningful long-term relationships with former students.
- Provide leadership and support to A-Level teaching staff, promoting consistent excellence across academic departments.
- Lead on alumni engagement and maintain productive connections with the Prep School to ensure a seamless school-wide experience.
- Work closely with the Deputy Head (Pastoral) to align the Sixth Form's pastoral strategy with the school's broader values and meet legal requirements for PSHE/RSE.
- Lead professional development initiatives for teaching staff, encouraging collaboration across academic departments, and mentoring junior teachers. Support the professional growth of Sixth Form staff, ensuring they are equipped to maintain high standards of teaching and learning.

Expectations as a Member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT):

- Act as a role model for both staff and students, maintaining high standards of professionalism, conduct, and integrity at all times.
- Ensure clear and effective communication with students, parents, and staff, fostering a collaborative and supportive school environment.
- Maintain a visible and active presence around the school, contributing to the broader life of the school, including boarding where appropriate.
- Ensure the Sixth Form contributes to the school's positive culture, including recognition and rewards that reflect the achievements of students and staff alike.
- Champion the student voice within the Sixth Form, ensuring students play an active role in school improvement.

The ideal candidate will demonstrate a passion for student success and personal development, with the ability to inspire and lead by example. They will have a proven record of strategic leadership, a commitment to academic and pastoral excellence, and a deep understanding of the challenges and opportunities in post-16 education.

- A warm, approachable nature with kindness, patience, and a good sense of humour, essential for building strong relationships with Sixth Form students as they navigate the complexities of their final school years.
- Exceptional resilience, with the ability to make sound, defensible decisions under pressure, ensuring the smooth running of the Sixth Form in a fast-paced and dynamic environment.
- Strong leadership qualities, including energy, enthusiasm, and the capacity to inspire, motivate, and guide Sixth Form students and staff toward academic excellence and personal growth.
- A deep commitment to the academic, emotional, and social wellbeing of Sixth Form students, fostering the development of well-rounded young adults prepared for life beyond school.
- Outstanding interpersonal and communication skills, capable of engaging effectively with Sixth Form students, teachers, and parents, creating a supportive and collaborative environment.
